

Expert	someone with a lot of knowledge, experience or training in something
Consultant	somebody who knows a lot about a subject and is employed by other companies to give advice about it
Executive	a high-level management role involving serious decision making
Specialist	someone with very detailed knowledge of a particular area of work

Officer	a person who has a position of authority in a hierarchical organization
Analyst	an individual who performs market research on segments of industries to identify trends
Coordinator	someone in charge of planning something and facilitating the occurrence of events or the collaboration between people
Associate	someone who is in a junior position relative to colleagues in the same position without the title



Anaesthetist /ə'ni:sθətɪst/

A person who administers anesthetics (reduces pain), usually a specially trained doctor or nurse.

- Anesthetize (numb) specific parts of the body
- Apply various levels of sedation (put you to sleep)
- Expert knowledge of airway management (breathing)
- Expert knowledge of pain control



Coroner /'kɔrənə/

A public official responsible for the investigation of violent, sudden, or suspicious deaths.

- Determine and certify cause/time/manner of death
- Order police investigations into death
- Legal and medical education & experience
- Approve burial/cremation/exhumation



Voice Actor /vɔɪs 'ækter/

Voice actors perform voices to represent a character or to provide information to an audience or user.

- Speak in multiple tones and accents
- Read clearly in a natural, conversational manner
- Deal with an erratic work schedule
- Network to find job opportunities



Paleontologist /pæl i ən'tɒl ə dʒɪst/

Paleontologists study the record of life on Earth left as fossils.

- Excavate (dig up) fossils from a variety of environments
- Analyse findings using advanced scientific equipment
- Publish papers and add to existing literature
- Strong scientific background (Geology & Biology)



Arborist /ɑ:ˈbərɪst/

A professional that plants, prunes, rescues, and maintains individual trees.

- Possess a vast knowledge of trees and the environment
- Diagnose problems and maintain individual tree health
- Plant, move and remove trees where necessary
- Prune dead limbs, fertilise soil and apply pesticides



Maître d'hôtel /meɪtrədəʊ'tel/

An experienced waiter that acts as the link between the kitchen, staff and guests.

- Be the face of the restaurant, greeting and seating guests
- Facilitate seamless operation between kitchen and floor
- Hire and fire staff, make schedules and take reservations
- Defuse guest complaints.



Sniper /'snajpə/

Snipers, or sharp shooters, are smart, disciplined, stealthy, highly accurate marksmen.


- Consistently hit targets over long distances
- Remain concealed and camouflaged for days
- Skilled in orienteering, reconnaissance and infiltration
- In prime physical and mental condition



Audiologist /ɔ:dɪ'ɒdɪələʒɪst/

Audiologists are ear specialists who examine, diagnose, and treat hearing and balance problems on a daily basis.

- Experts on ear anatomy and related health problems
- Clean ear canals, fit hearing aids and evaluate hearing
- Use audiometers, computers and medical devices
- Strong background in science, anatomy and physiology
